Schools Without Borders Charitable Status at a Glance

Securing and maintaining charitable status is a resource intensive process. Managing of charitable requirements call for both financial resources and expertise that can be difficult to maintain, especially as an organization in its early stages.

Legal Requirements

- Organizational audit
- Insurance (both directors and officers and general liability insurance)
- Maintaining a board of directors (at least three, not including the ED)
- Filing annual charity information returns
- Remaining committed to your registered charitable objectives
- Committing to a set of policies that govern the actions of your organization

Financial Logistics and Required Resources

- Accounting and Financial Practices
 - The annual audit costs anywhere from \$2000 \$10000.
 - Bookkeeping expenses for a year can cost anywhere from \$1000 \$3000/year.
 You can learn it yourself, but the job requires specific skills and diligence.
 - The tighter your financial systems are, the cheaper it is to have these services provided.
- Insurance
 - General Liability Insurance can cost anywhere from \$2000 \$5000/year depending on the nature and range of your programming
 - Directors and Officers Insurance usually costs \$1000+/year

Human Resources

Maintaining charitable status and generally accepted financial and accounting principles require a certain amount of human resources.

 It is necessary to have staff that can maintain organizational systems throughout your operations, to have a system that is easy to interface with as an average person. SWB will provide financial forms and procedures upon request.
